The purpose of this survey is twofold. First, this will aid in the establishment of standards and definitions of streams and water bodies at local resolution (1:4,800) as GIS data for streams is developed. Within the context of this survey, the word “stream” includes these entities: stream centerlines, double-line streams, perennial and intermittent streams, wetlands, lakes, ponds and reservoirs.

Secondly, this survey explores the varied uses of digital stream data among stakeholders in West Virginia. The results of this survey will be used to assess the current status of digital stream data as well as to preliminarily propose plans for improving the data infrastructure and data sharing arrangements in the state.
